Rebecca Bridges has been with the Grace Museum in Abilene since December 2012 beginning as Registrar. Prior to coming to the Grace, Rebecca served as the Registrar/Collections Manager for The Old Jail Art Center in Albany for almost five years. In March of 2016 she transitioned into the role of Programming & Interpretation where she is responsible for all adult, college, public and family programming as well as all in-gallery interactives and interpretation.

For the last two years Rebecca has served as Councilor-at-Large for TAM where she has served on the Communications and Development committees. In that role she has helped streamline and improve social media output and appeal, increase North Texas Giving Day revenue, and oversee, implement, and design the new TAM website. Rebecca has been an active member of the Texas Association of Museums since 2008. Beginning in 2009 she served as Councilor-at-Large for the Permian Basin Museum Association and then as President until its sunset in 2014. For the past two years Rebecca has served as the Chair for the Art Affinity Group. Rebecca has served a two-year term on the Annual Meeting Programming Committee, has been a speaker multiple times, and served on the Local Arrangements Committee for the 2017 Annual Meeting in Abilene.
